We are pleased to welcome Paul Colburn again with a presentation that focuses on the natural history of "Eastern Coyotes in Connecticut". His presentation focuses on the history of coyotes in Connecticut, an overview of coyote habitat, diet, behavior, and reproduction. It also provides practical



recommendations for optimum coexistence with our coyote population. Coyote artifacts are shared with the audience.

Paul Colburn is a 2015 graduate of the Master Wildlife Conservationist Program (MWCP) and a certified Master Wildlife Conservationist



(MWC). The MWCP is a Connecticut Department of Energy & Environmental Protection (DEEP) adult education program that trains volunteers in the fields of wildlife management, natural history and interpretation. Mr. Colburn has provided hundreds of wildlife presentations for a wide variety of public and private organizations in all corners of the state. He offers MWC presentations

on Black Bears (adult and children versions), Bobcats, Eastern Coyote, Fisher, White-tailed Deer and a natural history of Connecticut dating back to 1650. Mr. Colburn is an avid outdoorsman, a graduate of Wesleyan University and served honorably in the United States Army.
